Enrollment & Registration

- **El Roble Students**, who are Claremont residents, will receive a registration packet via mail in August. Registration week is the week before school starts (dates & times for registration will be included in your packet).
- Students on an Inter-District Transfer must submit paperwork to Student Services office by May 15, 2008.
- Ninth grade orientation will be during registration week in August.

- Student/Counselor confidentiality is and will be maintained.

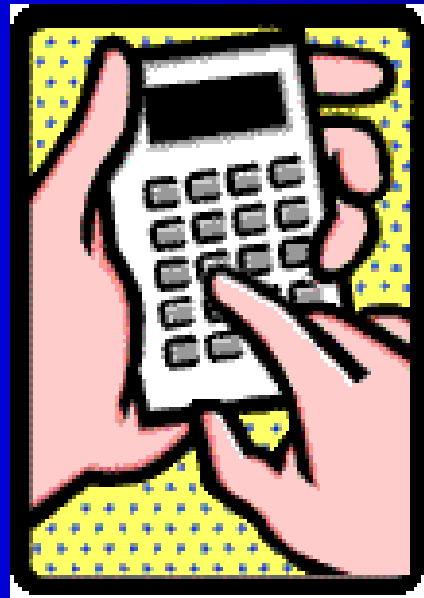
Grades

Credits

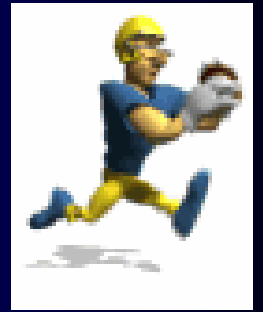
- 5 credits possible per course

- 220 credits required for graduation



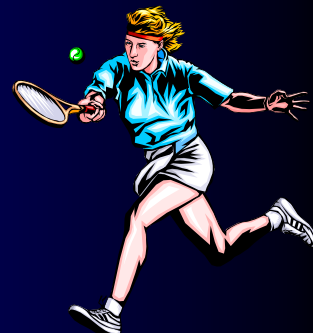

- 6 week session (Monday, June 23 – Thursday, July 31)
Suggested Enrichment/Required courses:
Visual Arts (2 period class), Ceramics (2 period class), Journalism 1/Creative Writing, Computer Ed, PE

Advanced Placement and Honors Courses

- CHS has many AP & Honors Classes
- Honors options for ninth grade:
 - Honors Freshman English (must be enrolled concurrently with H. Biology)
 - Honors Math (Geometry, Algebra 2, or Precalculus only)
 - Honors Biology (must be enrolled concurrently with H. English)
- Highly rigorous with extensive analytical reading and writing
- Must request the course AND meet the prerequisites
- UC weighs GPA for 10th – 12th grade course only
- Many colleges grant credit for a passing score on AP exam
 - AP tests are offered in May
- Course content is challenging. Thus, select carefully because switching to a “regular” class is not always possible once the semester has begun.

- Community College (Workforce Training, A.A. degree, transfer to 4-yr college)
 - Citrus, MtSAC, Chaffey
- Public College (4-yr program)
 - UCLA, UCR, Cal State LA, Cal State Fullerton
- Private College (4-yr program)
 - University of La Verne, Claremont Colleges, Pepperdine, APU
